Funded by the Department of Education and Training, Skills First Reconnect is focused on supporting disengaged high needs learners who require wrap around supports to assist them to engage with and succeed in education and training. The Pathway Support Worker - Reconnect will manage a caseload of clients in the Glen Eira, Kingston and Stonnington LGA's.

Key Objectives

- To conduct assertive outreach and community engagement
- To complete holistic assessments of participants' abilities and aspirations, learning needs, and career and personal goals
- To provide wrap around support to participants with acute levels of need to assist them to deal with these issues and progress toward education
- To ensure participants have control over their chosen pathway
- To track participants progress for six months once they have commenced an accredited course

Desirable Selection Criteria

- A qualification in any of the following areas: Youth Work, Community Services, Community Welfare, Education or a relevant field

- Experience in a community based service such as education, employment or youth programs

It is a requirement of this position that you must

- Have a current Driver's Licence and own vehicle
- Have a Working with Children Check (WWCC) or be willing to obtain
- Undergo a National Police check
